

HCA553 Current Issues in Healthcare Administration (3 credit hours) Course Syllabus

Course Description

The course is designed to expose students to significant current issues that impact the healthcare professional. Topical areas will include Healthcare Industry specific Marketing, Technology, Finance, Human Resources Management, the Political Environment, Healthcare Management and other current issues as they relate to the Healthcare Administrator. Topics will vary as changes to the industry environment dictate.

Course Learning Outcomes

By the end of this course, you will be able to:

- 1. Evaluate the literature that addresses current and emerging healthcare issues
- 2. Implement evidence-based practice by developing current strategies in the healthcare field
- 3. Analyze how healthcare systems models change based on the political environment.
- 4. Assess how organizational areas of marketing, finance, human resources and culture impacts administration.
- 5. Compare and contrast the communication responsibilities of healthcare administration.
- 6. Examine how technology impacts healthcare management.

Time Commitment

Effective time management is possibly the single most critical element to your academic success. To do well in this online class you should plan your time wisely to maximize your learning through the completion of readings, discussions, and assignments. Because of our

Expectation of learners will be completion of a variety of assignments including an interview paper, completion of a root cause analysis, submission of a video discussion board, and exploration of a healthcare trend students choose on their own. Throughout the course you will have the opportunity to engage in experiential learning exercises to help build your understanding of healthcare administration. The various activities throughout this course will be instrumental to your academic, personal, and professional knowledge development.
