

# HCA474 Social Aspects of Aging (3 credit hours) Course Syllabus

#### **Course Description**

This course introduces the student to core components and trends in social gerontology. Social, physical, economic, and political viewpoints are taken into account to assess the interdisciplinary nature within the field.

#### **Course Learning Outcomes**

By the end of this course, you will be able to:

- 1. Explore foundational methodologies and theories of social gerontology.
- 2. Assess aging from the perspectives of history, biology and psychology.
- 3. Examine relationships with family, living arrangements, and transitioning to retirement.
- 4. Analyze healthcare of the elderly from a systems thinking perspective
- 5. Research the economic and political aspects of aging in society.
