

HED201 Political Geography (3 credit hours) Course Syllabus

Course Description

This course begins with an introduction to the current political map of the world and the identification of relationships among physical environment, landforms, climate, resources, and these political boundaries. Students will learn how political relationships were formed, how different civilizations interacted with each other, and how these civilizations contributed to the development of the Western World from the Ancient World of Egypt to the Middle Ages of Europe.

Course Learning Outcomes

By the end of this course, you will be able to:

- 1. Explain the implications of geography on political boundaries.
- 2. Analyze the current world political climate as it relates to geography.
- 3. Demonstrate knowledge of major geographic and political features of civilizations around the world.

Time Commitment

All of these activities are planned around the content standards to prepare students to teach middle to high school level social studies in Ohio.
